Take a field trip into the past...

Old Fort Erie



Old Fort Erie was the first British fort built in what is now Ontario, Canada. During the War of 1812, the site was occupied by the American forces who used this strategic location as the base of their operations for the invasion of Upper

Canada. It was also the site of the Siege of Fort Erie, the scene of the worst fighting in the history of Canada. The Fort was destroyed by the Americans at the end of the War. Old Fort Erie was reconstructed during the 1930's and has become one of the premier interpreted sites on the War of 1812.

A Soldier's Lot

Step back in time at Old Fort Erie as students experience life in a recreated 1812 British Garrison. "The Soldier's Lot" program examines the life of the common soldier stationed in a remote outpost in Upper Canada. Explore the old stone fort's period rooms and working open-hearth kitchen. Programme varies from one to three hours, call for details.

Laura Secord Homestead

As a woman who undertook a perilous 32 kilometre (20 mile) journey to warn the British of an imminent American attack during the War of 1812, Laura Secord exemplified Canadian ideals of heroism. She was someone who had the courage and conviction to do what was right rather than what was easy. She put herself at risk in order to come to the aid of others, and contributed to the preservation of the land which would become Canada, and the people who would become Canadians.



The Legend & The Lady

The Laura Secord Homestead offers an accurate restoration of the house in which the Secord family lived from 1803 to 1835. Knowledgeable staff in period costume assist students in exploring the myths and realities of this remarkable Canadian heroine, as well as the intriguing story of Ontario's past.

Mackenzie Printery & Newspaper Museum

The Printery began operation in 1990 as a venture between The Niagara Parks Commission and the Printery Committee, a volunteer group concerned with the preservation of traditional printing



methods in the advancing world of digital print technology. The Printery is located in the restored home of William Lyon Mackenzie, where he printed his first newspaper the Colonial Advocate in 1824. Using this medium, he expressed his ideas for political reform, which culminated in the short-lived Rebellion of 1837 in Upper Canada.

The Printer's Apprentice

Working heritage presses and typesetting facilities allow students a hands-on experience at the Printery. Citing Mackenzie and his newspaper, the Colonial Advocate, as an example of the power of the printed word, an interactive approach is taken as students "set type" and print to explore the history of printing and printing technology.
